I am writing you to voice my opinion against the proposed solar farm near Jean, Nevada. I do not think it is fair or right to close the public land that we all enjoy to provide a place for a private company to install their solar business. This area by Jean is especially important to keep open to all citizens for all types of users as it is unique in its location and terrain. This is one of the only areas left close to Las Vegas where law abiding, tax paying citizens may enjoy their publically owned land for off highway vehicle use. The solar company should go buy its own land for its private business or if it wants public land then consider some other more remote, unused public area that does not affect so many current users.
